

National Taiwan Normal University Guidelines for the Five Educational Dimensions Awards

1. The National Taiwan Normal University Guidelines for Five Virtues Awards (the "Guidelines") are promulgated to encourage students to uphold the university's motto (honesty, integrity, diligence and modesty) and recognize students who excel in their diversified development in the five dimensions of education: moral, intellectual, physical, social, and aesthetic.

2. Target recipients: Undergraduate students at the University.

3. Awards:

(1) Moral Excellence Award: Students who have shown good moral character with a strong sense of ethos, dedicating themselves to community service and welfare.

(2) Intellectual Excellence Award: Students who have demonstrated their ability in acquiring professional knowledge, or have participated in academic or skill competitions with outstanding performance.

(3) Physical Excellence Award: Students who have shown achievements in physique or physical fitness, the promotion of physical and mental health, or the development of good exercise habits, or have participated in sports competitions with outstanding performance.

(4) Social Excellence Award: Students who have demonstrated achievements in teamwork, interpersonal relationships and collaborative efforts with leadership skills, a spirit of mutual support and connection with their peers.

(5) Aesthetic Excellence Award: Students who have shown an elevated awareness of aesthetics and understanding of art and culture, demonstrated their talents in culture, art, or music, or have participated in art or music competitions with outstanding performance.

4. Quota and selection: These awards are conferred once every semester. The selection process is as follows:

(1) For students who meet the award criteria and have specific achievements in the previous semester, each class may nominate 1 student for each of the five awards. If the class size exceeds 50 students, the class may nominate 1 additional student for each award. A nominated student may receive multiple awards.

(2) The selection forms and nominee lists shall be submitted to the Division of Student Assistance, Office of Student Affairs before the end of October in the fall semester and before the end of March in the spring semester. Each winner will receive a certificate of excellence and an NT\$2,500 award.

5. Each department shall select the nominees through a departmental meeting or convene a

selection meeting, and avoid letting students nominate among themselves in class meetings or through designation.

6. Source of funding: The awards are supported by the student public funds and incentive funds of the University.

7. The award will be recorded in the student's e-Portfolio in the University.

8. Students who have received all five awards during their studies will be awarded a university motto certificate and commended in public.

9. The Guidelines and any amendments thereto become effective after approval by the Student Affairs Office Meeting and ratification by the University President.
